STUDENT DUE PROCESS RIGHTS

MTC 1044

All students are entitled to due process when they are subjected to disciplinary actions such as suspension or expulsion. The Mitchell School Board and College officials have the legal authority to deal with disruptive students and student misconduct. Due process, for most situations, shall be met when:

1. The student receives oral or written notice of pending charges;
2. The student is given an oral or written explanation of the facts that form the basis of the proposed disciplinary action;
3. The student is allowed to have an advisor present during any proceedings, including interviews with MTC officials; and
4. The student is given an opportunity to present their version of the incident.

The student may appeal the imposed disciplinary action as specified in policy MTC 1045.
