MITCHELL TECHNICAL INSTITUTE ADVISORY COUNCIL

MTI 330

Mitchell Technical Institute shall utilize an institutional advisory council. This council shall serve in an advisory capacity to the MTI President, Vice Presidents, and the Mitchell Board of Education and Administration. Acceptance of the advice of the Strategic Advisory Council (SAC) is at the option of the Board of Education and Administration. The Council shall exist during the time it is authorized by the Mitchell Board of Education. Since the Mitchell Board of Education is the legally constituted authority over the Mitchell Technical Institute (MTI), it surrenders none of its authority or responsibilities in establishing an advisory council for MTI matters.

In its advisory capacity, the Council's primary goal will be to improve Mitchell Technical Institute's strategic direction and positioning in order to provide for the best possible education of the students; to ensure industry requirements are being met; and to ensure the long term success of the institution. Council members can accomplish this overarching goal by:

1. Reviewing the MTI organizational direction and goals to ensure they are in the best interest of industry and the state
2. Providing liaison and communication between MTI and industry, communities and state government
3. Ensuring the maintenance of political support for MTI goals and objectives
4. Promoting communications between the public, businesses, and the school
5. Supporting and promoting MTI and its endeavors in public and private forums
6. Influencing legislative and public activities to ensure statutes and public opinion support MTI's endeavors and present MTI in a positive light

AMENDMENT OF CHARTER

Changes in the charter may be made by a majority vote of the members of the council and approval of the Mitchell Board of Education.
